This is believed to be the first time that a website user interface has ever been made available in that language. We are working hard to get it live soon. Hoopoe Books, in partnership with SIL International, has announced that they will make their 12 book titles available in bilingual editions covering some of the key minority languages of Afghanistan. These will be made available in DDL when they are prepared. Planned editions will include Turkmen-Dari, Uzbek-Dari, Hazaragi-Dari, Sawji-Pashto, and Nuristani-Pashto. According to Hoopoe Books, “This will enable hundreds of thousands of Afghan children to learn to read wonderful stories in their mother tongue, and transfer those skills, using the same story, to their one of the two official languages — Dari or Pashto — in about Grade 3, so that they are able to read in the language they will need in order to continue their education”. We are excited to take part in this amazing initiative!
